REGULAR MEETING
MINUTES

Lyons Falls ALIVE held its regular meeting on Thursday, May 10, 2012, with twenty-two members present. President Fawcett opened the meeting at 6:00 p.m. Virginia Fitzgerald made a motion, seconded by Peg Abbott, to accept the minutes of the April meeting. All present agreed, there were no additions or corrections.

The Treasurer reported \$827.12 in the Farmers Market account, \$6765.30 in the ALIVE account and sixty-two members. We received \$500 from the Hospital and \$100 from the Iroquois Gas Line for sponsorships.

Farmers Market: The Market will open on Tuesday, June 12. Gary reported they are doing well with vendors. There will be a beef vendor, Cleve Lansing from Boonville. There will also be an ice cream truck. The Firemen will be selling lunches in the auxiliary building. They are trying to get wine and cheese vendors.

Village Report: Mayor Liendecker reported the Brownfield Opportunity Area Public meeting is Wednesday, May 16, at 6:30 p.m., at Forest Presbyterian Church in the Fellowship Hall. The Fitness Trail stations are in. The next step is to put wood chips along the stations. There will probably be a ribbon cutting ceremony the first week in June. A member of the Cain family will be coming to town and will discuss the refurbished wrought iron fence. The placement of the planters has been decided and each one has a volunteer to maintain it with the Village DPW doing the watering. The Welcome sign is up.

History Association: Roy reported the Association has established an annual scholarship for SLCS. It is to recognize a student who has shown a willingness to preserve the history of the area, volunteer and help others through community service.

Festival/ Parade: Chris reported plans are moving on schedule for the parade. The Trillium Fiddlers will play at 11, the Adirondack Chorus will sing at noon, and the Army Band is still uncertain. The Army will provide a color guard. Scott said he will have a kayak demo, the auction and bouncies are set to go.
